Luke 18:1-8 (ESV)

Luke 18:1-8 "And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'" And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

Luke 18:1 "And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart."

Four Key Elements of Prayer:

- 1. Ought—It is necessary to pray; it is proper; one should pray
- 2. Always—At all times
- 3. Pray—Jesus teaches about prayer because He prayed and did it often during His earthly ministry.
- 4. Not lose heart—Become discouraged; grow weary; lose enthusiasm.

Luke 18:2-6 "He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man." And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' Contrast: Widow and Believers:

- 1. We are children of God and God cares for us.
- 2. We have open access into the Father's presence.
- 3. We have an advocate; we have a high priest.
- 4. We have the very Word of God to claim.
- 5. We go to the throne of Grace.
- 6. We have all God's riches to meet our every need.

Contrast: Judge and the Father:

- 1. God is holy and loves His children.
- 2. God does not have to be bribed.
- 3. God answers our prayers for His glory and our good.
- 4. God will always answer our prayers, either quickly or delayed.

Luke 18:7-8 "And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

 If the unjust judge would give justice, then imagine how God (the just Judge) will answer our prayers and provide for our needs quickly.
