



#4 Meet Their Needs Matthew 12:1-8

LORD OF THE SABBATH

Matthew 12:1 At that time Jesus went through the grain fields on the Sabbath. His disciples were hungry and began to pick some heads of grain and eat them.² When the Pharisees saw this, they said to him, “Look! Your disciples are doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath.”³ He answered, “Haven’t you read what David did when he and his companions were hungry?⁴ He entered the house of God, and he and his companions ate the consecrated bread—which was not lawful for them to do, but only for the priests.⁵ Or haven’t you read in the Law that the priests on Sabbath duty in the temple desecrate the Sabbath and yet are innocent?⁶ I tell you that something greater than the temple is here. ⁷**If you had known what these words mean, ‘I desire mercy, not sacrifice,’ you would not have condemned the innocent.** ⁸For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath.”

Gleanings from the Grain Field...

- #1 Jesus was signaling the advent of a new era, the breaking in of the kingdom of God.
- #2 All law must serve the Law of Love.
- #3 Jesus, Lord of the Sabbath, is the One Who gets to define how the Sabbath-keeping principle is rightly to be carried out.
- #4 Jesus wants us to meet peoples’ practical needs rather than looking for supposedly “spiritual” reasons to avoid doing so.
