

## Identity Crisis: Wheat & Tares Matthew 13:24-20, 36-43 (ESV)

Exploring the Parables of Jesus

## Importance of Parables:

How should the **<u>PROMISE</u>** of Jesus' return impact the way His children think, pray, and behave?

Main point: Because of this promise, it should impact us.

- Having an impact means that something has a **POWERFUL OR MAJOR INFLUENCE**.
- o These parables should change the way you think, pray, and behave.

## The Context:

- 1. KINGDOM OF HEAVEN being described (v.24)
  - a. We often think the phrase refers to a place or people, but it really refers to the <u>ACTIVITY OF THE KING</u>.
  - b. God's CHILDREN carry out the activity of the King on the EARTH.
  - c. The man OWNS the field and GOOD SEED was planted.
- 2. Enemy came at night and planted tares (weeds) among the wheat (v 25-26)

a. Why was this big deal?

3. Servants find out about tares being planted (v. 27-28)

a. The roots were INTERTWINED.

- 4. Master's Response (v. 29 30)
  - a. Let them <u>GROW TOGETHER</u> until the harvest then the reapers will gather tares and wheat

## The Interpretation:

- 1. Who is the 'Son of Man' that sows the seed? (v.37)
  - a. Jesus is the Son of Man who sows the seed and it is all about His **IDENTITY**.
  - b. Jesus wants to identify with our <u>HUMANITY</u> and express his <u>DIVINE</u> authority.
- 2. Jesus is sowing seed in HIS field (v. 38)
- 3. Who are the crops? (v.38)
  - a. The wheat are the sons of the <u>KINGDOM</u> & the tares are the sons of the <u>EVIL ONE</u>

b. We <u>WERE ALL TARES</u> and the wheat is planted in the world for a <u>PURPOSE</u>.

c. Being around tares does  $\underline{\textbf{NOT}}$  change the  $\underline{\textbf{IDENTITY}}$  of wheat.

- d. Tares need an **IDENTITY TRANSFORMATION** in order to become wheat.
- 4. Why is all of this important? (v.39-43)

a. The harvest is coming and the tares will be **<u>SEPARATED</u>** from the wheat.

- b. Wheat goes into the barn of the master (God's house)
- c. Tares going into the fiery furnace (Hell)
- d. How do the sons of the kingdom INFLUENCE the sons of the evil one?
- e. What does your FRUIT look like? (Galatians 5:22-23)
- f. Your fruit is not something you produce because you <u>DO SOMETHING</u>. Your fruit is the natural consequence of <u>BEING A CHILD OF GOD</u>. It is all about your Gospel Shaped Identity.

So the question becomes are you a Son/Daughter of the  $\underline{\text{KINGDON}}$  or a Son/Daughter of  $\underline{\text{SATAN}}?$ 

**Thought #1:** I've put my faith in Jesus for a long time, but never considered myself a son or a daughter.

You have missed the main point of the  $\underline{\textbf{GOSPEL}}.$  The Bible is God's story of creating a family.

When the world  $\underline{\textbf{SURROUNDS}}$  you with lies, remember the  $\underline{\textbf{TRUTH}}$  of God's word.

I am a <u>CHILD</u> of God, I am a <u>NEW</u> creation, I am <u>COMPLETE</u> in Christ, I am light.

**Thought #2:** The only separator in the eyes of Jesus is which <u>FAMILY</u> you are a part of.

<u>John 3:16</u> "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life"

Thought #3: Why does this matter to us?

The gospel message we speak <u>**TO THE WORLD**</u> needs to match the behavior we <u>**DISPLAY IN THE WORLD**</u>.
