

Theism in Focus

Norm Giesler = "Theism is the belief that a transcendent God created the universe as a reality distinct from Himself but which He actively sustains through both a system of natural law which He created and through divine intervention at the moments He deems such action appropriate for the accomplishment of His divine will."

Romans 1:19-20 (NIV) ...since what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them. ²⁰ For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse.

<u>Romans 2:14-15</u> (NLT) Even Gentiles, who do not have God's written law, show that they know his law when they <u>instinctively obey it</u>, <u>even without having heard it</u>. ¹⁵ They demonstrate that God's law is written in their hearts, for their own conscience and thoughts either accuse them or tell them they are doing right.

Romans 1:20-25 (NIV) For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse. ²¹ For although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God nor gave thanks to him, but their thinking became futile and their foolish hearts were darkened. ²² Although they claimed to be wise, they became fools ²³ and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images made to look like a mortal human being and birds and animals and reptiles. ²⁴ Therefore God gave them over in the sinful desires of their hearts to sexual impurity for the degrading of their bodies with one another. ²⁵ They exchanged the truth about God for a lie, and worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator—who is forever praised. Amen.

How do we know this "Creator"/ "uncaused cause" is the God of the Bible?

Our confidence that Christianity is TRUE rests in reliability of 2 things:

<u>Hebrews 1:1-3</u> (NIV) In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, ²but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. ³The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Maiesty in heaven.

1st = The reliability of Jesus =

<u>John 10:30-33</u> (NIV) I and the Father are one." ³¹Again his Jewish opponents picked up stones to stone him, ³²but Jesus said to them, "I have shown you many good works from the Father. For which of these do you stone me?" ³³"We are not stoning you for any good work," they replied, "but for blasphemy, because you, a mere man, claim to be God."

<u>John 14:6</u> (NIV) Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father <u>except through me</u>.

<u>1 Corinthians 15:3-6</u> (NIV) For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. ⁶After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep.

2nd = The reliability of the BIBLE =

<u>2 Timothy 3:16</u> (NIV) All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness,

<u>Isaiah 40:8</u> (NIV) The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever."

Hebrews 2:5-10a (NIV) It is not to angels that he has subjected the world to come, about which we are speaking. ⁶But there is a place where someone has testified: "What is mankind that you are mindful of them, a son of man that you care for him? ⁷You made them a little lower than the angels; you crowned them with glory and honor ⁸and put everything under their feet." In putting everything under them, God left nothing that is not subject to them. Yet at present we do not see everything subject to them. ⁹But we do see Jesus, who was made lower than the angels for a little while, now crowned with glory and honor because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. ¹⁰In bringing many sons and daughters to glory...
