1. "Blessed are the Poor in Spirit": TOTALLY DEPENDENT UPON GOD

<u>The Kingdom of this World:</u> "Blessed are the self-reliant and self-sufficient"

<u>Definition:</u> destitute; completely bankrupt; totally dependent

<u>The Blessed:</u> Those who are aware of their deep spiritual poverty and realize

they are completely dependent upon God

<u>Examples:</u> The tax collector (Luke 18:9); Jesus (II Corinthians 8:9)

<u>Evidences of Need:</u> self-sufficient, comparing self with others, focused on their faults; prayerlessness; ungratefulness; entitlement

<u>Repentance:</u> Apart from Christ, I have nothing and can do nothing (John 15:5) <u>The Blessing:</u> Entrance into God's Kingdom

2. "Blessed are those who Mourn": BROKEN OVER SIN

The Kingdom of this World: "Blessed are the tough, the hardened, the

indifferent—those who don't let things get to them"

<u>Definition:</u> severe grief, deep sorrow, bereavement over loss

The Blessed: Those who are sensitive to sin and broken over it

Examples: David (Psalm 51), Isaiah (Isaiah 6)

<u>Evidences of Need:</u> laugh at sin, deny sin, rationalize sin, excuse sin, wallow in guilt, try to reform

<u>Repentance:</u> I see my sin and others' sin from God's point of view (Psalm 51) <u>The Blessing:</u> The Comfort of Forgiveness

3. "Blessed are the Meek": COMPLETELY SURRENDERED TO GOD

<u>The Kingdom of this World</u>: "Blessed are the dominant, who assert their power; blessed are the stubbornly rebellious who make their own way." <u>Definition</u>: willing submission, yieldedness, gentleness; power under control <u>The Blessed</u>: Those who submit and yield their 'rights' to God

Examples: Abraham, Joseph, David

<u>Evidences of Need:</u> floating anger and resentment; entitlement mentality, seeking retaliation, asserting rights, lack of teachability

Repentance: I yield my 'rights' to God and to others (Romans 12:1-2)

The Blessing: The Inheritance of the Earth

4. "Blessed are those who Hunger and Thirst for Righteousness":

THE SPIRITUALLY HUNGRY

<u>The Kingdom of this World:</u> "Blessed are those who thirst for excitement and thrills"

<u>Definition:</u> Obsessive, desperate desire for more of Jesus, His Word, and His Righteousness

<u>The Blessed:</u> Those who are hungry to be right with God, and who pursue God's character in their lives

Examples: David (Psalm 63); Mary (Luke 1); Paul (Philippians 3)

<u>Evidences of Need:</u> casual, passionless Christianity, lack of desire for God's Word, prayer, connection with believers, lack of attention to teaching; misguided spiritual ambition

<u>Repentance:</u> I see my appetite for things other than Christ; I cultivate my spiritual appetite (Matthew 4:4; I Peter 2:2)

The Blessing: Spiritual Satisfaction in Christ's Perfect Righteousness

5. "Blessed are the Merciful": THE ACTIVELY COMPASSIONATE

<u>The Kingdom of this World:</u> "Blessed are those who care just enough to get noticed; blessed are those who help those people who deserve to be helped" Definition: a heart-level concern for others that begs for expression

<u>The Blessed:</u> Those who see needs and are moved to act

Examples: the Good Samaritan (Luke 10), Stephen (Acts 7:60)

<u>Evidences of Need:</u> unforgiveness, apathy, insensitivity to need; lack of empathy; holding a grudge; resentment

<u>Repentance:</u> I see that I am undeserving of God's mercy; I am grateful to have received it, and see myself as a conduit for His mercy to others

The Blessing: Obtaining Even More Mercy from God! (and others)
