Conversation #3 – The Man's Parents and the Pharisees John 9:18 The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had					

received his sight, until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight ¹⁹ and asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was

born blind? How then does he now see?"

Conversation #4 – The Man and the Pharisees, Round 2

John 9:24 So for the second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. We know that this man is a sinner." ²⁵ He answered, "Whether he is a sinner I do not know. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."

Conversation #5 – Jesus and the Man

John 9:35 Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" ³⁶ He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" ³⁷ Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who is speaking to you." ³⁸ He said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him.

Conversation #6 – Jesus and the Pharisees

John 9:39 Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and those who see may become blind." ⁴⁰Some of the Pharisees near him heard these things, and said to him, "Are we also blind?" ⁴¹ Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no guilt; but now that you say, 'We see,' your guilt remains."
