

## #1 The Reformer: Martin Luther

<u>Hebrews 12:1 (NIV)</u> Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us

<u>Romans 1:17 (NIV)</u> For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."

**Ephesians 2:8-9 (NIV)** For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—<sup>9</sup> not by works, so that no one can boast.

**2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NIV)** All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, <sup>17</sup> so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

<u>Acts 17:2 (NIV)</u> As was his custom, Paul went into the synagogue, and on three Sabbath days he reasoned with them **from the Scriptures...** 

Psalm 119:97-105 (NIV) Oh, how I love your law! I meditate on it all day long. <sup>98</sup> Your commands are always with me and make me wiser than my enemies. <sup>99</sup> I have more insight than all my teachers, for I meditate on your statutes. <sup>100</sup> I have more understanding than the elders, for I obey your precepts. <sup>101</sup> I have kept my feet from every evil path so that I might obey your word., <sup>102</sup> I have not departed from your laws, for you yourself have taught me. <sup>103</sup> How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! <sup>104</sup> I gain understanding from your precepts; therefore I hate every wrong path. <sup>105</sup> Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.

**Joshua 1:8 (NIV)** Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful.

<u>1 Peter 2:5, 9 (NIV)</u> ...you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. <sup>9</sup> But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.
